This program is for newcomer women interested in providing childcare from the comfort of their homes and learning the insides of working with children, parents and community organizations.

During this information session you will:

- Learn program details and benefits of the program
- Learn the responsibilities of a Home Child Care Provider
- Receive registration forms and the questionnaire to apply to the program

To apply you must:

- Be a woman who is a Permanent Resident or Convention Refugee or Live-in Caregiver with a work permit
- Attend an information session and demonstrate the ability, commitment and readiness to complete the training
- Agree to sign an attendance and learning contract
- Complete all 8 sessions which includes a 2 day Standard First Aid/CPR to receive a certificate

Update: The Mother craft program is set to begin Tuesday, February 23 and end on Tuesday, March 30, 2021, 10-noon. There will be three online sessions and self-study. Attendees will be required to complete 2 day CPR Training (details to come).
